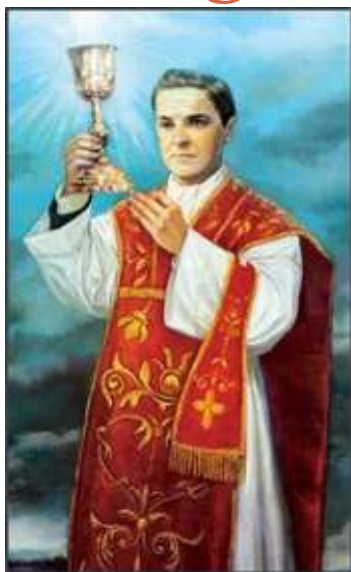

Pope Francis proclaims “Year of St Joseph” **8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.**



Pope Francis proclaims “Year of St Joseph”

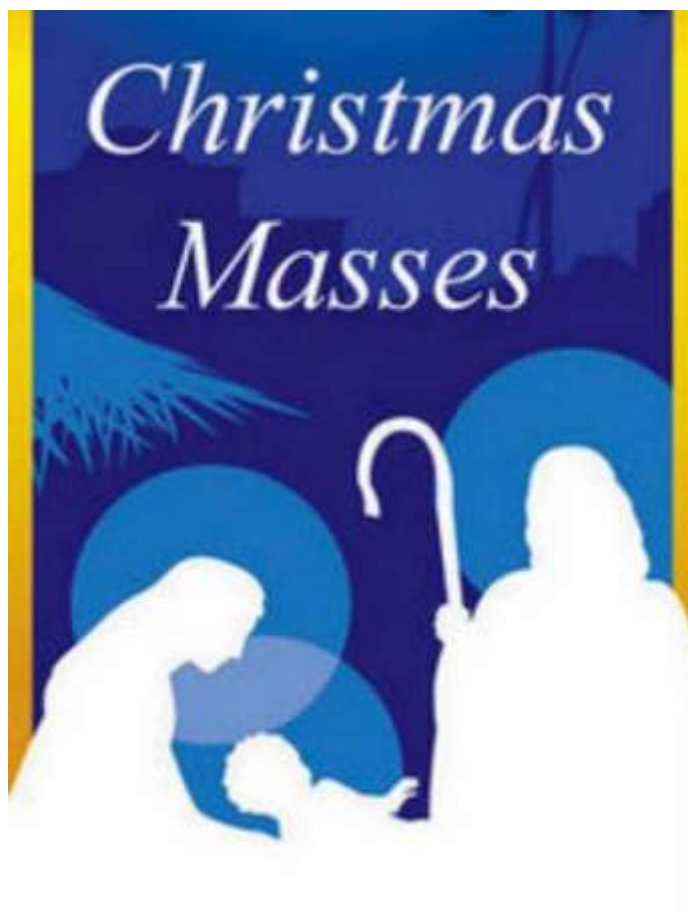
Pope Francis proclaims a Year of St. Joseph on the 150th anniversary of the dedication of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.

With the Apostolic Letter “*Patris corde*” (“With a Father’s Heart”), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a “Year of Saint Joseph” from today, 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

The Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX’s declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To celebrate the anniversary, Pope Francis has proclaimed a special “Year of St Joseph,” beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021.

The Holy Father wrote *Patris corde* against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of “ordinary” people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, “the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence,” who nonetheless played “an incomparable role in the history of salvation.”

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION - January 2021



WHY PARTICIPATE IN FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION?

Looking to escape the distractions of daily life and spend some quiet time with the Lord? Then join us the first Friday of every month as we adore Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

WHAT IS FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION?

First Friday Adoration, a St. Joseph tradition, is a Eucharistic adoration held the first Friday of every month in the church. It begins with 8:00 AM and is followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for the remainder of the day.

WHAT FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION PARTICIPANTS DO:

- Come any time during the adoration hours (approximately 8:00 to spend some quiet, prayerful time with Jesus.
- Some regular adoration participants commit to specific time slots every First Friday to ensure that the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone.
- Must be a fully initiated Catholic adult (18+)
- Is a registered parishioner of St. Joseph
- Attends Mass and receives the sacraments regularly
- Has a deep reverence for the Holy Eucharist

Commits to spending time with the Blessed Sacrament every month during First Friday Adoration

To participate in First Friday Adoration, simply come to the church on the first Friday of the month. Exact dates and times are in the church bulletin. To address this urgent need, Brother Knights and their families who are not already isolated due to illness, age or underlying conditions are encouraged to donate blood. COVID-19 Antibody Testing On All Donations

An antibody test screens for antibodies in your blood, which are formed when fighting an infection, like COVID-19. An antibody test assesses whether your immune system has responded to the infection, not if the virus is currently present. The COVID-19 antibody test is authorized by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and may indicate if the donor's immune system has produced antibodies to the coronavirus, regardless of whether they developed symptoms. Donors who test positive for COVID-19 antibodies may have the unique opportunity to help patients fighting the disease.

AbbaCare Pregnancy Resource Center Martinsburg Ultrasound Program Timeline

AbbaCare Pregnancy Resource Center is a life-affirming pregnancy resource center that has been serving women and families facing unplanned pregnancy in the Winchester, VA area for over 30 years.

In 2019, AbbaCare began to feel God's calling to reach the neighboring community of Martinsburg/Berkeley County, West Virginia. We began to pray for God to provide the infrastructure that would be necessary to open a second pregnancy center location in Martinsburg. Primarily this would consist of a facility, staffing (reception, ultrasound nurse, and trained counselor), and equipment (ultrasound machine and related equipment).

God has been so faithful to answer! We have secured a short-term location (601 South Raleigh Street, Martinsburg - sharing space with the Good Samaritan Free Healthcare clinic) that will support us for the first couple of phases of our expansion in Martinsburg. This location is small - only 1,000 square feet with limited counseling and office space, so we know that as we continue to the third phase, we will need to secure a larger and more permanent location. In addition, God has provided a Martinsburg staff of 3 (a volunteer receptionist, and a nurse and counselor that split time between Winchester and Martinsburg), and a portable ultrasound that was paid for by a generous donor. We elected for a portable ultrasound machine for phases 1 and 2 (see timeline below) because we know that our current location is temporary, and we are able to carry the machine back and forth between Winchester and Martinsburg as needed (so it can be a back-up in Winchester as well as the primary machine in Martinsburg during phases 1 and 2).

So moving forward, what will be our needs in the next couple of years? As you'll see from the projected timeline below, we hope to be in a larger, more permanent location in approximately 2-3 years, at which time we will need to purchase a stand-alone/stationary ultrasound machine so that we don't have to continue carting the portable back and forth (which is not good for the machine). The portable ultrasound machine will then become a back-up for either location as needed. This new stationary machine will cost approximately \$29,000.

For these reasons, we feel that our recent introduction to the Martinsburg Community Knights of Columbus is God-ordained! This faithful group has been raising funds for an Ultrasound Project for the last three years, not knowing for sure who would be the beneficiary of these funds, since at that time there was no pregnancy resource center in the area. As we have met with Dave Martin of the Knights, it appears that as they continue their fundraising efforts, the timing may work out perfectly for them to reach \$15,000 in raised funds, which, if matched by the Supreme Knights of Columbus, would cover the cost of the stationary machine when we are ready to purchase it in approximately 2-3 years. We would be agreeable for the Knights to maintain those funds in your own "account," ear-marked for the AbbaCare Martinsburg ultrasound machine until such time that we are ready to make the purchase (when we are into a more permanent space).

In closing, please see the timeline below for a more complete understanding of our projected plans, and please also feel free to reach out to us directly or through Dave Martin with any questions. We are so humbled and honored to be considered as a potential beneficiary of this generous and life-saving program.

The Global Wheelchair Mission

FAITH IN ACTION - COMMUNITY PROGRAMS



Our Council has started a new Program called "The Global Wheelchair Mission". We will be looking for volunteers, fund-raising ideas, and places or people that are in need of these Wheelchairs.

Help change the lives of people with disabilities worldwide by having your council donate at least \$150 for a wheelchair. Through partnerships, councils can also purchase a large container of 110 to 280 wheelchairs for their own donation sites. A featured program, Global Wheelchair Mission counts for two credits toward the Columbian Award.

The Knights of Columbus has partnered with the American Wheelchair Mission and under the umbrella of the Global Wheelchair Mission. This initiative provides aid to those who lack the freedom of mobility in our communities and around the world. Whether councils are presenting wheelchairs to

local veterans and neighbors in need or donating funds to benefit those abroad, mobility brings with it independence and dignity. Obtained at discounted prices, these wheelchairs change the lives of their recipients. Working with the Global Wheelchair Mission is a perfect opportunity to put your faith into action and involve the entire community in the rewarding charitable work done by your council.

The brand new wheelchairs are available in 5 sizes (12, 14, 16, 18 & 20-inch seat widths) and would sell for over \$500 in a medical supply store, but because they are shipped by 100 wheelchair containers from the factories directly, we can do this at an average price of \$150 each.
