

### **November—dedicated to the poor souls in purgatory**



#### NOVEMBER DEVOTION

The month of November is dedicated to the poor souls in purgatory. All souls day falls on November 2nd, which is when we commemorate all the faithful departed. The indulgences attached to this devotion are seven years and seven quarantines each day; plenary indulgence on any day of the month under the usual conditions.

**From November 1st until November 8th, the faithful may gain each day one plenary indulgence for the souls in Purgatory, with the following conditions:**

Pay a visit to a graveyard or cemetery and pray for the departed

#### **On All Souls Day (November 2nd)**

Another indulgence may be gained with the same conditions, while visiting a church and reciting one Our Father and one Apostles Creed.

#### **Requirements to gain a plenary indulgence:**

- Go to confession within the 8 days before or after
- Go to communion on the same day
- Reject all attachment to sin, even venial sin
- Pray for the intentions of the Pope.

## Faith Alone or Good Works?

Two founding tenets of Protestantism are: Sacred Scriptures contain the only authoritative source of Divine Revelation, and; Salvation is attained by faith alone. Martin Luther is the pre-eminent proponent of “faith alone” -- *Sola Fides* in Latin.

Luther apparently has a very strong case. Biblical citations for justification through faith are numerous.

St. Paul’s epistles contain many such citations. His letters to the Ephesians, Galatians, Philippians, and Romans all speak of justification through faith. Likewise, the Acts of the Apostles has similar statements. Moreover, Evangelists St. John and St. Mark quote Jesus proclaiming that faith in Him and His heavenly Father results in eternal life. However, there are also trenchant New Testament passages noting the importance of good works, two citing Jesus’ own words.

First, though, it’s necessary to understand what St. Paul means when he says that man is justified by faith in Jesus Christ and not by works of the law. Paul was a hyper-observant Jew -- a Pharisee. These people reacted against what they considered to be inattention to or deliberate ignorance of the strictures of the Law of Moses, as given by God Himself. Pharisees set themselves up as judges as to who was a good Jew and who was not, according to the Law of Moses. Paul was so zealous in his thinking and actions that he watched approvingly as St. Stephen was stoned to death for what Paul considered blasphemy, and afterward Paul got a letter of permission from Jewish religious rulers to find and arrest Christians in Damascus.

But St. Paul's encounter with the risen Jesus changed his mind and heart completely, and forevermore. Paul's encounter gave him unshakeable faith in Jesus as Messiah and Savior. And because of this, he changed his mind about the Law of Moses. So when Paul wrote about faith in Jesus justifying someone, he's asserting that the Law of Moses can only condemn behavior which does not conform to that law: It cannot justify anyone. Faith in Jesus, though, gives eternal life. In Corinthians II Paul wrote: "The letter kills, but the Spirit gives life." So following the Law of Moses is not the same as doing good works; it means that disobedience to all the "do's and "don'ts" of the Law means death and not life. In his letter to the Galatians (3:24), Paul distinguishes between the Law and good works: "The Law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith." It's obvious that the Law simply means doing what you're told.

Keeping this in mind, St. Matthew's Gospel quotes Jesus has saying that good works are essential (25:31-46). Jesus said that at the Last Judgment, those who did good works --- feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, and visiting the imprisoned --- would be welcomed into Heaven. To those who did not, though, the King would say, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels."

Also, the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan depicts the case of one person in real need, and three people who have the opportunity to help him. Both the priest and the Levite --- the most distinguished and honored of Jews --- saw the beaten man lying on the ground. But instead of helping him, they crossed to the other side of the street so they would not have to help him. But the Samaritan, whose people shun Jews and are shunned by them, pitied him, gave him first aid, brought him to an inn, and paid the innkeeper to provide him a bed and to look after him. He even told the proprietor that he would repay any additional expenses incurred in taking care of him.

Jesus asked the legal expert (probably a Pharisee) which of the three passersby “was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?” The legal expert replied, “The one who had mercy on him.” Jesus told him, “Go and do likewise.” Thus, Jesus could not have been clearer about the need to do good works.

The Epistle of St. James also stresses the necessity of good works for salvation, but Luther --- apparently not liking St. James’ message --- calls the epistle “a work of straw.” (Oddly, he’s quoted in other sources as saying good things about the epistle.) In the epistle of James (2:14, 20, 24), is this: “What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him?” And this: “But do you want to know, O foolish man, that faith without works is dead?” And the most important statement is this: “You see then that a man is justified by works, and not by faith only.” The most rational and reasonable conclusion, therefore, that neither faith nor good works can help a man attain salvation apart from the other. The solution is not *either/or*, but *both/and*.

However, something else is in play in this debate: The confusion about justification and righteousness.

Briefly, when Protestants read in the New Testament that faith justifies, they mean that the beginning of life as a Christian is the declaration of faith in Jesus Christ. No amount of good works can substitute for that declaration of faith. Catholics agree; but for Catholics, that declaration of faith is just the beginning of Christian life. It’s not sufficient to go through life as a Christian by thinking and saying faith is all you need. For Catholics, once you have embraced faith in Jesus, you must spend your life putting your faith to work --- doing good works. Catholics believe that performance of good works is righteousness --- a form of justification.

### **FIRST FRIDAY - October 7, 2022**



#### **Adoration starts after 12:00pm Mass**

There is no specific practice except to remain quiet while keeping company with the Presence of Christ. You may pray, read your Bible or another spiritual book, say the Rosary, or simply meditate while contemplating on the mystery of the Eucharist and the graces we have received from it. There needs to be at least one person present, but more than one is preferred.

#### **6:30PM-7:00 Reconciliation**

This is also known as confession. In the Roman Catholic Church people go to confession to say sorry for the wrong (sin) in their lives and to experience God's healing through forgiveness. Confession also permits reconciliation with the Church, which is wounded by the sins people commit.

#### **7:00pm Benediction**

Benediction of the blessed sacrament, a non liturgical devotional service, has as its central act the blessing of the congregation with the eucharistic Host. You are not required to attend the Benediction, but are invited to participate.


### **Coats for kids 2022**

## Traveling Chalice for Vocations



A program of Prayer for Vocations. Parishioners are asked to take the chalice home for a week and display it in a place of honor. We ask them to pray daily for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured in prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray daily for vocations.

### How the Program Works

Each week, At the end of Mass, the family is called by the priest to come forward to receive the chalice box and a blessing. (This box contains a consecrated chalice, the prayer card and stationery to send notes of encouragement to the Seminarians, Priests and Religious). The family takes the chalice home and puts it in a place of honor.

Each day for a week, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family prays for an increase and perseverance of vocations. They can also send a note of support to a Seminarian, Priest or Sister. The following Saturday afternoon before Mass the family returns the chalice box for another family to take home.

### **White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP) Week: 30 Years Strong**

**"We care! We count!"**

Thirty years ago, Norma Norris started a revolution for human dignity with those words. In 1987, much like today, the world seemed determined to tell us that we were an obscure minority in a society that accepted and endorsed pornography and sexual exploitation. While sitting in church listening to Pastor Msgr. Francis Glenn lament that the public was indifferent to pornography's dissemination, Norma had an epiphany.

She realized that America was wrong in thinking that people were indifferent to pornography. People did care and those people counted.

She recognized that the only reason people thought no one cared, was because those that cared were not being heard. With that thought came the birth of the White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP) week—a campaign to give a voice to those opposing pornography.

Norma knew the plan had to be simple and inexpensive, but she never intended it to be humble. From the beginning, Norma made waves with landmark victories including huge white ribbon bows being sent to the Governor and the Attorney General of Pennsylvania and an organized motorcade. The highlight of the campaign was the bulldozing of a closed pornographic bookstore in 1987. With that impactful first WRAP week, Norma and defenders for dignity across the country set a strong precedent for the national phenomena that has now endured for 30 years

## **CDA COURT 392 - CDA SUNDAY OCTOBER 30, 2022** **WHITE RIBBONS AGAINST PORNOGRAPHY WEEK**

Since its founding, WRAP week has galvanized the best of Americans in their fight against pornography. From putting up anti-pornography billboards, to organizing anti-pornography motorcades and parades, to rallying dignitaries such as mayors and governors, WRAP week has always helped bring the fight for dignity to center stage across America. In fact, WRAP week has even inspired the state of Utah to adopt February as WRAP month and helped pass the Utah Children's Internet Protection Act in 2009. This proved to be an important precedent that helped to usher in Utah's proclamation declaring pornography a public health crisis in 2016. Utah has since been followed by South Dakota, Arkansas, and Tennessee in declaring pornography a public health crisis.

**This year, White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP) week is as strong as ever with new ways to take back ground in the fight against sexual exploitation.**

Visit our WRAP webpage and our Resources webpage for ideas and materials that will help you mobilize your community for this year's WRAP week. Remember, the fight against sexual exploitation is more important now than it has ever been, and all of our recent victories are because of the noble efforts each of you make in your communities.

Carry on in the good fight, and make the 2017 WRAP week the next big blow to the sexual exploitation industries!

For the fifth consecutive year, the National WRAP campaign kicked off on the last Sunday in October, and supporters loudly began expressing their anti-pornography cries with the symbolic white ribbon (for decency) and plenty of unfounded evidence.

WRAP (White Ribbon Against Pornography) claims pornography is dangerous and addictive; it leads to violence, sexual abuse and exploitation; and it damages relationships and healthy sexual development in young people. I've even read this: "Pornography is a plague of the worst kind, silently destroying families from the inside out, ensnaring good men and women, and brutally enslaving teens and children in more than one way."
