





## Open Wide Door!



*Behold, I stand at the door and knock: if any man hears my voice and opens the door,*

*I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me. --- Revelation 3:20*

This is an amazing statement, and it comes from Jesus Himself. It's almost impossible to conceive of Jesus coming into one's home and having supper with us. The Son of the living God entering our home, eating the food we prepare, being with us and conversing with us: No experience could surpass or even come close to that.

However --- many, many of us don't open our door. Or, if we do, we don't open it widely enough for Jesus to enter. And He will not force His way in. We must open it widely for Him of our own free wil

Why? Two reasons:

First, we're afraid -- with reason -- that If we do, Jesus will ask us to do things we would rather not do, to and with people we would rather not know.

Recall Jesus' parable about the good Samaritan.

*"A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'*

*"Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"*

*The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."*

Make no mistake: Jesus is telling us to go and do likewise. And Jesus wants us to have pity, and to reach out to and take care of not just well-dressed people who have been beaten and robbed. He wants us to give to anyone who asks us for something:

*"Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back." -- Luke 6:30*

That includes all the undesirables we want nothing to do with.

So --- to open wide your door means to be ready to **DO** what Jesus asks of us.

Second, beyond our treatment of those we don't know, Jesus will ask us to **BE** a different kind of person to those we know and care about. And we don't want to do that. We like the way we are. It's not that we like our failings; it's that we don't want to make the effort to change. Change is hard -- perhaps the hardest thing a person can do.

Is there a husband who does or doesn't do -- and say or not say -- at least three or four things that irritate his wife? Even if we make a sincere effort to change, we still fail a large percentage of the time. And that's exasperating, and even demoralizing.

What husband isn't irritated or even infuriated by certain things his wife does or doesn't do -- and says or doesn't say -- no matter how long the disagreements have lasted? Ask yourself: Has doing it your way, trying to make her agree to your viewpoint and do what you want, succeeded? And yet, if we were to offer the problem to Jesus and ask for his help, do we think it's anything He couldn't handle? The answer, as much as we might dislike it, is to acquiesce -- give in. Using a statement that has gotten much use over the years: "Let go and let God." If what you want is supposed to come about, it will. If it doesn't, it's good it to realize that you didn't waste even more time and effort trying to make it happen. And this holds true for all those we care about.

The saddest thing in all human experience may be to come near the end of life and realize that while Jesus was knocking at our door, we were afraid to open it.

## **First Friday Devotion**

### **FIRST FRIDAY - October 7, 2022**



#### **Adoration starts after 12:00pm Mass**

There is no specific practice except to remain quiet while keeping company with the Presence of Christ. You may pray, read your Bible or another spiritual book, say the Rosary, or simply meditate while contemplating on the mystery of the Eucharist and the graces we have received from it. There needs to be at least one person present, but more than one is preferred.

#### **6:30PM-7:00 Reconciliation**

This is also known as confession. In the Roman Catholic Church people go to confession to say sorry for the wrong (sin) in their lives and to experience God's healing through forgiveness. Confession also permits reconciliation with the Church, which is wounded by the sins people commit.

#### **7:00pm Benediction**

Benediction of the blessed sacrament, a non liturgical devotional service, has as its central act the blessing of the congregation with the eucharistic Host. You are not required to attend the Benediction, but are invited to participate.

## 40 Hour Devotion - October 9 - October 11



40 Hour Devotion starting October 9 and finishing on October 11. Briefly, if you do not know or cannot remember, 40 hours is a Eucharistic devotion of 40 hours of adoration. A few years ago, we had one, and now that we have resumed normal operations, we will begin again. This year, it will be preached. **Fr. Gallagher is pleased and grateful to say that Father Szabo will be returning here to preach it.** Please pray for Father Szabo as he prays and prepares for our parish 40 Hours. As October becomes closer more info will follow.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a traditional Eucharistic devotion in the Catholic Church. With this devotion, we honor the presence of Christ in the Eucharistic bread, become the Body of Christ.

Silence before the Mystery of Love: This act of remaining in Jesus is an act that is done in silence. Silence sometimes is uncomfortable for people. We feel that if we are not saying something to God, we are not really praying. We are afraid that our silence will soon lead to our minds wandering; while our bodies may be in a posture of prayer, our brain is at the supermarket or work or making lists of things we need to get done this day. How much Jesus desires us to rest in him: "Be still and know that I am God!" Our self-reliance leads to internal chatter. However, to have the Eucharist as a visible focus for our eyes will allow us to be drawn back into a peace as we recognize in Jesus that he really is in charge of our lives. In that silence we find our minds, hearts and souls experiencing a deep peace that He alone can give.



### **Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Fundraiser**



#### Football Frenzy Sweepstakes

Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Fundraiser is conducted during the Fall and Winter months and has been used by the State Council for several years now. This fundraiser is based on pro football scores.

Tickets cost \$10.00 and are valid for the last 10 weeks of the pro football season; this year from November 6, 2022, to January 8, 2023. If you buy two tickets, you can get one free, which is redeemable online.

I strongly encourage everyone who buys tickets to go online and register them with Green Bee. This will ensure that the tickets are entered into the Sweepstakes even if their ticket stubs don't physically make it to Green Bee (e.g., lost in the mail or otherwise mishandled). \$700.00 is given away each week for 10 weeks for total cash prizes in the amount of \$7,000.00. The Tickets have 4 teams each week for 10 weeks and the 4 teams change weekly No two tickets have the same 4 teams on any given week. Team codes are listed on the back of the Ticket. Prizes are awarded weekly to the Ticket holders with the 4 teams that score the most or least number of points combined (i.e., "Highest 4-Team Totals" down to "Lowest 4-Team Totals" with five other winners in between). Winning Ticket numbers are posted weekly online, and winners are notified by mail. Winners do not need to claim a prize. Prizes will be mailed automatically. It makes no difference whether a team wins or loses, and **no proceeds go to the NFL**. The scores for the previous week's game will be used for teams that are not scheduled to play on any given week (i.e., bye weeks). Scores and winners will be posted weekly on Tuesdays following the dates on your Ticket starting Tuesday, November 8, 2022. 

## Join the Knights of Columbus—Today



Since 1882, membership in the Knights of Columbus has been open to men 18 years of age or older who are "practical" (that is, practicing) Catholics in union with the Holy See. Since that time, the Knights of Columbus has understood "practical catholic" to mean a Catholic who accepts the teaching authority of the Catholic Church on matters of faith and morals, aspires to live in accord with the precepts of the Catholic Church, and is in good standing in the Catholic Church.

## Traveling Chalice for Vocations



A program of Prayer for Vocations. Parishioners are asked to take the chalice home for a week and display it in a place of honor. We ask them to pray daily for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured in prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray daily for vocations.

### How the Program Works

Each week, At the end of Mass, the family is called by the priest to come forward to receive the chalice box and a blessing. (This box contains a consecrated chalice, the prayer card and stationery to send notes of encouragement to the Seminarians, Priests and Religious). The family takes the chalice home and puts it in a place of honor.

Each day for a week, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family prays for an increase and perseverance of vocations. They can also send a note of support to a Seminarian, Priest or Sister. The following Saturday afternoon before Mass the family returns the chalice box for another family to take home.



**CDA Sunday October 30, 2022 - White Ribbons Against Pornography Week begins**

### **White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP) Week: 30 Years Strong**

**We care! We count!”**

Thirty years ago, Norma Norris started a revolution for human dignity with those words. In 1987, much like today, the world seemed determined to tell us that we were an obscure minority in a society that accepted and endorsed pornography and sexual exploitation. While sitting in church listening to Pastor Msgr. Francis Glenn lament that the public was indifferent to pornography’s dissemination, Norma had an epiphany.

She realized that America was wrong in thinking that people were indifferent to pornography. People did care and those people counted.

She recognized that the only reason people thought no one cared, was because those that cared were not being heard. With that thought came the birth of the White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP) week—a campaign to give a voice to those opposing pornography.

Norma knew the plan had to be simple and inexpensive, but she never intended it to be humble. From the beginning, Norma made waves with landmark victories including huge white ribbon bows being sent to the Governor and the Attorney General of Pennsylvania and an organized motorcade. The highlight of the campaign was the bulldozing of a closed pornographic bookstore in 1987. With that impactful first WRAP week, Norma and defenders for dignity across the country set a strong precedent for the national phenomena that has now endured for 30 years

## **CDA COURT 392 - CDA SUNDAY OCTOBER 30, 2022 - WHITE RIBBONS AGAINST PORNOGRAPHY WEEK**

Since its founding, WRAP week has galvanized the best of Americans in their fight against pornography. From putting up anti-pornography billboards, to organizing anti-pornography motorcades and parades, to rallying dignitaries such as mayors and governors, WRAP week has always helped bring the fight for dignity to center stage across America. In fact, WRAP week has even inspired the state of Utah to adopt February as WRAP month and helped pass the Utah Children's Internet Protection Act in 2009. This proved to be an important precedent that helped to usher in Utah's proclamation declaring pornography a public health crisis in 2016. Utah has since been followed by South Dakota, Arkansas, and Tennessee in declaring pornography a public health crisis.

**This year, White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP) week is as strong as ever with new ways to take back ground in the fight against sexual exploitation.**

Visit our WRAP webpage and our Resources webpage for ideas and materials that will help you mobilize your community for this year's WRAP week. Remember, the fight against sexual exploitation is more important now than it has ever been, and all of our recent victories are because of the noble efforts each of you make in your communities.

Carry on in the good fight, and make the 2017 WRAP week the next big blow to the sexual exploitation industries!

For the fifth consecutive year, the National WRAP campaign kicked off on the last Sunday in October, and supporters loudly began expressing their anti-pornography cries with the symbolic white ribbon (for decency) and plenty of unfounded evidence.

WRAP (White Ribbon Against Pornography) claims pornography is dangerous and addictive; it leads to violence, sexual abuse and exploitation; and it damages relationships and healthy sexual development in young people. I've even read this: "Pornography is a plague of the worst kind, silently destroying families from the inside out, ensnaring good men and women, and brutally enslaving teens and children in more than one way."
