

## Catholic Dedication Of Month

### September - the Seven Sorrows of Mary



September is traditionally dedicated to the Seven Sorrows (or *Dolours*) of Mary, and the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows falls in September. The Sorrows are: **the prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the Holy Child at Jerusalem for three days, meeting Jesus on his way to Calvary, standing at the foot of the Cross, Jesus being taken from the Cross, and the burial of Christ.**

#### *The Seven Graces of this Devotion*

1. I will grant peace to their families.
2. They will be enlightened about the Divine mysteries.
3. I will console them in their pains and I will accompany them in their work.
4. I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of my Divine Son or the sanctification of their souls.
5. I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will protect them at every instant of their lives.
6. I will visibly help them at the moment of their death, they will see the face of their Mother.
7. I have obtained this Grace from my Divine Son, that those who propagate this devotion to my tears and dolours, will be taken directly from this earthly life to eternal happiness since all their sins will be forgiven and my Son and I will be their eternal consolation and joy.

### Worthy Lecturers Corner



#### **Evidence Is Not Proof**

Ever wonder why belief in God, & in His Son, is not more widespread? Why doesn't God or Jesus simply appear to everyone at once, plainly & for all to see, & declare Himself to be God? The answer is that God gives us evidence of His existence & His love, at first by His own Hand, & then through His Son. But he does not give us proof.

Evidence vs. proof: Let's consider that.

In Mark's Gospel we get a dose of this difference:

*Mark 6:1-6 – 1. He went away from there and came to his own country; and his disciples followed him. 2. And on the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue; and many who heard him were astonished, saying, "Where did this man get all this? What is the wisdom given to him? What mighty works are wrought by his hands! 3. Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. 4. And Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor, except in his own country, and among his own kin, and in his own house." 5. And he could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands upon a few sick people and healed them. 6. And he marveled because of their unbelief....*

So --- they had heard evidence of Jesus' mighty deeds performed in towns & villages all around them. But that wasn't proof. After all, God had not opened the heavens & appeared & said in unmistakably clear language that Jesus was His one & only Son, & that they must believe Him & do whatever he told them. Jesus' amazing cures of desperately ill or disabled people hadn't been done *in front of them*. There *could* be a non-supernatural explanation for many miracles; they could even have been phony, staged by Jesus & his disciples to fool the gullible. And these Nazarenes did not want to be considered gullible. Then, as now, most people didn't want to be thought of as gullible; their mindset was, as is said these days, "I'm from Missouri: Show me!"

Now for the observant, God provides evidence almost everywhere of His existence & His love. We can discern it in all of Nature: If astronomers are correct, the entire universe began as a single point, & then exploded away from itself at light speed, creating all we can see & measure with every kind of instrument. And as the song from *Hair* pointed out, **we are stardust**. Every atom that exists was once part of a star. An author named Eckhart Tolle, in a book titled *The Power of Now*, writes:

*"There is clearly an intelligence at work that is far greater than the mind. How can a single human cell measuring 1/1000<sup>th</sup> of an inch in diameter contain instructions within its DNA that would fill 1,000 books of 600 pages each?"*

### Worthy Lecturers Corner

The Church terms this physical evidence, when discerned & comprehended by the reasoning power of the human mind, Natural Law. It's capable of being grasped & understood by a rational person. But understanding & accepting Natural Law only takes us so far & not all the way to Jesus & His Father & the Holy Spirit. I like to imagine it as a winding path up a cliff to a precipice. Standing on its edge, a marvelous view of creation is spread before us. But looking straight ahead, we see a chasm between us and the rocky earth on which is the path down the cliff. That chasm is wide, & we faint-hearted fear it is unreachable. But it is not.

**The one who believes he can leap across it does so successfully --- no matter how puny his physical or mental ability.**

The far side of that cliff, across the chasm, is the path to salvation & everlasting life with God & His angels & saints. **But we cannot reach it without faith.** This is exactly what St. Paul was telling the Philippians (4:13): *"I can do all things in Him who strengthens me."* And four centuries later, St. Augustine gave us a wonderful clue to making the leap successfully:

*"Do not seek to understand so that you may believe; believe, that you may understand."*

So, then: The key thing to keep in mind is that, in order to receive God's free gift of salvation & everlasting life, we must accept it, say yes to it. He will not force it on us. We must make that leap of faith, trusting that we will reach the other side.

Back to the beginning: If God did indeed appear to everyone at once in all His power & glory, humanity would see & accept it as fact --- but it would not necessarily embrace Him & love Him. Only after leaping successfully across the chasm do we begin to understand that God truly is love & mercy itself, & that though all of creation gives evidence of His existence, it is faith that enables us to have proof -- to experience God, & to experience Him as love itself.

## **First Friday Devotion**

### **FIRST FRIDAY - September 2, 2022**



#### **Adoration starts after 12:00pm Mass**

There is no specific practice except to remain quiet while keeping company with the Presence of Christ. You may pray, read your Bible or another spiritual book, say the Rosary, or simply meditate while contemplating on the mystery of the Eucharist and the graces we have received from it. There needs to be at least one person present, but more than one is preferred.

#### **6:30PM-7:00 Reconciliation**

This is also known as confession. In the Roman Catholic Church people go to confession to say sorry for the wrong (sin) in their lives and to experience God's healing through forgiveness. Confession also permits reconciliation with the Church, which is wounded by the sins people commit.

#### **7:00pm Benediction**

Benediction of the blessed sacrament, a non liturgical devotional service, has as its central act the blessing of the congregation with the eucharistic Host. You are not required to attend the Benediction, but are invited to participate.

## 40 Hour Devotion - October 9 - October 11



40 Hour Devotion starting October 9 and finishing on October 11. Briefly, if you do not know or cannot remember, 40 hours is a Eucharistic devotion of 40 hours of adoration. A few years ago, we had one, and now that we have resumed normal operations, we will begin again. This year, it will be preached. **Fr. Gallagher is pleased and grateful to say that Father Szabo will be returning here to preach it.** Please pray for Father Szabo as he prays and prepares for our parish 40 Hours. As October becomes closer more info will follow.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a traditional Eucharistic devotion in the Catholic Church. With this devotion, we honor the presence of Christ in the Eucharistic bread, become the Body of Christ.

Silence before the Mystery of Love: This act of remaining in Jesus is an act that is done in silence. Silence sometimes is uncomfortable for people. We feel that if we are not saying something to God, we are not really praying. We are afraid that our silence will soon lead to our minds wandering; while our bodies may be in a posture of prayer, our brain is at the supermarket or work or making lists of things we need to get done this day. How much Jesus desires us to rest in him: "Be still and know that I am God!" Our self-reliance leads to internal chatter. However, to have the Eucharist as a visible focus for our eyes will allow us to be drawn back into a peace as we recognize in Jesus that he really is in charge of our lives. In that silence we find our minds, hearts and souls experiencing a deep peace that He alone can give.



### **Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Fundraiser**



The Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Fundraiser is conducted during the Fall and Winter months. I'm fairly certain that most of you are aware of how this fundraiser works since the State has been utilizing it for several years now. This fundraiser is based on pro football scores. Membership cards or "Tickets" cost \$10.00 and are valid for the last 10 weeks of the pro football season from November 6, 2022, to January 8, 2023. If you buy two tickets, you can get one free, which is redeemable online. I strongly encourage everyone who buys tickets to go online and register them with Green Bee. This will ensure that their tickets are entered into the Sweepstakes even if their ticket stubs don't physically make it to Green Bee (e.g., lost in the mail or otherwise mishandled). \$700.00 is given away each week for 10 weeks for total cash prizes in the amount of \$7,000.00. The Tickets have 4 teams each week for 10 weeks and the 4 teams change weekly. No two tickets have the same 4 teams on any given week. Team codes are listed on the back of the Ticket. Prizes are awarded weekly to the Ticket holders with the 4 teams that score the most or least number of points combined (i.e., "Highest 4-Team Totals" and "Lowest 4-Team Totals"). Winning Ticket numbers are posted weekly online, and winners are notified by mail. Winners do not need to claim a prize. Prizes will be mailed automatically. It makes no difference whether a team wins or loses, and **no proceeds go to the NFL**. The scores for the previous week's game will be used for teams that are not scheduled to play on any given week (i.e., bye weeks). Scores and winners will be posted weekly on Tuesdays following the dates on your Ticket starting Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

Results can be checked online by going to [www.wvko.fc.org](http://www.wvko.fc.org) and clicking on the Football Frenzy logo. Complete 2022 Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Fundraiser Instructions are attached. The Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Fundraiser Tickets, Instruction Letters, and Posters will be provided to the District Deputies this weekend at the State Organizational Meeting July 15-17, 2022, for subsequent distribution to the Councils. All Ticket Stubs, Money, and Forms must be turned in by **October 17, 2022**. Checks should be made payable to your Local Council. As many of you are aware, this is an excellent fundraiser for the State and your Local Council. The Council receive \$3.00 back for each ticket sold. After that and other expenses (i.e., the cost of the Tickets and Prizes), the first \$5,000.00 go to Catholic Education. After that, 60% of remaining proceeds go to the Scholarship Fund and 40% go to the General Fund.



## Traveling Chalice for Vocations



A program of Prayer for Vocations. Parishioners are asked to take the chalice home for a week and display it in a place of honor. We ask them to pray daily for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured in prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray daily for vocations.

### How the Program Works

Each week, At the end of Mass, the family is called by the priest to come forward to receive the chalice box and a blessing. (This box contains a consecrated chalice, the prayer card and stationery to send notes of encouragement to the Seminarians, Priests and Religious). The family takes the chalice home and puts it in a place of honor.

Each day for a week, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family prays for an increase and perseverance of vocations. They can also send a note of support to a Seminarian, Priest or Sister. The following Saturday afternoon before Mass the family returns the chalice box for another family to take home.
