Jesus' Presentation: A Triple Feast

February 2nd of each year is thrice blessed in the liturgical calendar of the Holy Catholic Church. The date is 40 days after Christmas (40 is an important number for our Church: 40 days and nights of deluge for Noah in the ark; 40 years of the Israelites wandering in the desert; 40 days when Jesus prayed & fasted in the desert, 40 days of Lent, 40 days from Easter to Jesus' Ascension, etc.).

First, it is the Feast of Jesus' Presentation, because Jewish parents brought their firstborn male babies to the Temple in Jerusalem for special blessing 40 days after birth. Second, it is the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, because Jewish mothers came to the Temple for ritual bathing 40 days after childbirth. Third is the Feast of Candlemas, when churches bless all the candles -- symbolizing Jesus as the Light of the World -- that they will use that year.

Jesus' presentation in the Temple is recounted in the second chapter of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew:

“Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord’s Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

“Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word;
for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,
a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.’

“And the child’s father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, ‘This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed -
- and a sword will pierce your own soul too.’”

Lecture's Corner

As for the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in the 12th chapter of the Book of Leviticus, it states that the Law of Moses requires a woman to undergo ritual purification for forty days after bearing a son, and to present a sacrifice at the Temple to become ritually clean and re-enter the community. The Blessed Virgin Mary performed this duty as the Mosaic Law instructed.

Finally, February 2nd is also the Feast of Candlemas. On this date the Church blesses all the candles -- symbolizing Jesus as the Light of the World -- that will be used that year.

In times past many interesting national customs were part of Candlemas, some of which are still celebrated. Wikipedia describes several of them.



After the 12:00pm Mass, the adoration begins. During this time, it is important to maintain a quiet atmosphere while being in the presence of Christ. At 8:00pm, there will be Benediction. This non-liturgical devotional service focuses on blessing the congregation with the eucharistic Host. Attending Benediction is not mandatory, but you are warmly encouraged to join and participate.

Traveling Chalice for Vocations



Prayer Program for Vocations is in place where parishioners are invited to bring the chalice home for a week and display it in a prominent location. The purpose is to encourage daily prayers for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Praying for vocations is a powerful way to show support. Vocations are a calling from the Holy Spirit and are nurtured through prayer. By praying for vocations, we lift up those individuals whom God is calling to follow Him in a special way. We hope that those who take the chalice home will continue to pray daily for vocations. Here's how the program works: At the end of Mass each week, the priest calls a family forward to receive the chalice box and a blessing.

This box contains a consecrated chalice, a prayer card, and stationery to send notes of encouragement to seminarians, priests, and religious individuals. The family then takes the chalice home and places it in a position of honor. Throughout the week,

during designated prayer times such as morning, bedtime, or meals, the family prays for an increase and perseverance of vocations. They also have the option to send supportive notes to seminarians, priests, or sisters. On the following Saturday afternoon, before Mass, the family returns the chalice box so that another family can participate.


